Instructions for abstracts for oral or poster presentation and workshop proposal submissions

Instructions for Authors

- Abstracts submitted should represent original research; that is, the abstract should not have been presented or published as an abstract or a full journal paper prior to the 13th IAAH World Congress 2025
- Abstracts should relate to one of the following conference themes:
 - o Climate Change
 - o Conflict, Crime, and Violence
 - o Health and Well-Being: Mind and Body
 - o Parenting and Family
- Authors of research papers involving humans or animals must attest that their work has been approved by relevant review boards.
- The presenting author must attest that all authors have agreed to the submission and should also indicate whether the authors have any conflicts of interest or financial incentive from the research presented in the abstract.
- The corresponding author's contact information should be provided in the submission form.
- The abstract should be organized and formatted as follows: Title, Background, Aims/Objectives, Methods, Results, and Conclusion. The abstract must not exceed 2000 characters.
- All co-authors' names, degrees, and emails must be included.
- There should be no references, tables, figures, pictures, graphs etc. in the abstract.
- Abstracts should be under 2000 characters.

Additional details for workshops only:

- Workshop duration is typically 60-90 minutes.
- Authors must submit a minimum of three educational learning objectives. These should be measurable descriptions of what attendees should be able to do upon completion of the session.
- Presenters can use a mix of didactic, experiential, or other teaching methods.

Workshop Presenter Information

Upon acceptance, presenters will be asked to submit:

- CV
- Recent professional photograph (jpeg)
- Description for inclusion in the World Congress program
- Five multiple choice questions that can be answered by workshop participants upon conclusion of the workshop
